- Entry form deadline: AUGUST 15, 2017 (After 8/15/17, late fees will apply.)
- Required forms: Hold Harmless Waiver
- All exhibitors must enter: herdsmanship and barn decorations.
- Vet check-in: refer to Livestock Guide

### OPEN GOAT RULES

1. All goats must be tagged with an official USDA Scrapie Eradication program assigned flock identification tag.
2. All goats must be registered in respective breed association. Have registration papers available on Wednesday at check-in. Tattoos must correspond to registration papers. Original registration papers must be shown for all animals over 6 months. Temporary and duplicate registrations are accepted for animals under 6 months, when needed.
3. All goats must be dehorned, disbudded or polled. Scurs must be trimmed to less than two inches.
4. All dairy goats must be clipped prior to check-in time, unless used for clipping demonstration at the Fair.

Otherwise, clip and fit your animal to their breed association’s standard.

5. Tattoos must be legible. Owner must provide microchip reader, if chipped.
6. All exhibitors must show proof of compliance with the scrapie identification program with a copy of your premise flock ID number through the USDA APHIS VS.
7. Each Exhibitor must verify the Division and Class they entered. Any errors need to be corrected with the superintendent(s) prior to the show. Judging sheet will be available the day before the open show.
8. Classes may be combined in show ring, within same Division, to expedite the judging time. Premiums will not be affected. Exhibitors will be notified of the show order and any changes in advance.
9. Entries may be limited due to number of pens available and space constraints.

**Junior Classes (not to have kidded)**

- 1 - Doelings, 0-4 months
- 2 - Doelings, 4-8 months
- 3 - Doelings, 8-12 months
- 4 - Does, 1-2 years, dry

**Senior Classes (must have kidded)**

- 5 - Does, 1 year and under 2 that have kidded
- 6 - Does, 2 years and under 3 that have kidded
- 7 - Does, 3 years and under 4 that have kidded
- 8 - Does, 4 years and under 5 that have kidded
- 9 - Does, 5 years and over that have kidded

**Group and Specialty Classes**

- 10 - Dam and Daughter, one Sr. doe and one daughter
- 11 - Produce of Dam, two does any age, same dam.
- 12 - Get of Sire, Meat Breeds, three does, any age and same buck.
- 13 - Breeders Trio, three does all own and bred by one exhibitor.
- 14 - Three Generations, granddam, dam and daughter. Three does representing three generations.
- 15 - Best Female Pair, Two does owned and bred by one exhibitor.
- 16 - Best Udder in Show, any doe from any Senior class. Enter all Senior does in milk.

**DIVISION 06-M .....HERDSMANSHIP**

All exhibitors compete throughout the duration of the Fair.
