REQUIREMENTS

1. Participants must pre-register for all classes in this Department by July 28th, 6pm (office) or 12pm (online).
2. Participants must be enrolled in the 4-H Shooting Sports project in which they are registering in order to compete, i.e. Archery, Rifle, Pistol, or Shotgun.
3. All rifle, pistol, shotgun, and archery equipment brought to the event locations must arrive in appropriate cases, bags, or boxes so as not to create a distraction to the public or other event participants. This applies to both club owned and individual equipment.

EVENT DESCRIPTIONS AND RULES

1. ARCHERY – RECURVE / LONG BOW

One adjustable sight pin or multiple hunting style sight pins may be used, no string peeps allowed. Kissers buttons, mechanical release aids, and stabilizers are permitted. Maximum draw weight is 40 lbs. for this range. Non County owned bows must be approved by Superintendent prior to scheduled shooting time.

Modified Field Round (Indoor): Competition will consist of three rounds; 1 game makes a round. Each game is 18 arrows; ends noted below. Junior, Intermediate, and Senior round equals 36 arrows at the following distances.

FITA Round Modified (Outdoor): Competition will consist of three rounds; 1 game makes a round. Each

game is 18 arrows shot in 6 arrow ends. Junior, Intermediate, and senior round equals 36 arrows at the following distances.

Safety Equipment: Archers will be required to utilize an armguard and a form of string-hand finger protection, i.e. finger tab or shooting glove.

2. ARCHERY – COMPOUND BOW: FITA ROUND

Release aids, stabilizers and string peep sights are permitted. No prism, lens, or other magnifying device may be used. Maximum draw weight is 40 lbs. for this range. Non County owned bows must be approved by Superintendent prior to schedule shooting time.

Modified Field Round (Indoor): Competition will consist of three rounds; 1 game makes a round. Each game is 18 arrows; ends noted below. Junior, Intermediate, and Senior round equals 36 arrows at the following distances.

FITA Round Modified (Outdoor): Competition will consist of three rounds; 1 game makes a round. Each game is 18 arrows shot in 6 arrow ends. Junior, Intermediate, and Senior round equals 36 arrows at the following distances.

Safety Equipment: Archers will be required to utilize an armguard and a form of string-hand finger protection, i.e. finger tab, shooting glove, or mechanical release.

Archery – Recurve / Long Bows / Compound Bow - Divisions 1 & 2 – Modified Field Round (Indoor)

- Target will be 40 cm faces, blue & white, single bull for all classes.
- Course of fire will be the same for all classes: 6 ends of 3 arrows at 10 and 15 yards; 3 ends of 6 arrows from 20 yards.
- Time limit will be 4 minutes per 6 arrow end & 2.5 minutes per 3 arrow end.
- Scoring will be scored from 10-ring (center) 10,9,8,7,6,5, to the outside. X's are tie-breakers.

Archery – Recurve / Long Bows / Compound Bow - Divisions 1 & 2 – FITA Tournament (Outdoor)

- Juniors (Age 8-10) 80 cm colored target, 18 arrows each at 35, 45, and 50 feet.
- Intermediates (ages 11-13) 80 cm colored target 18 arrows each at 45, 60 and 70 ft.
- Senior (ages 14-18) 80 cm and 144 cm colored target, 18 arrows each at 60, 75, and 90 feet.

- Scoring will be scored from 10-ring (center) 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 to the outside.

3. AIR RIFLE

This is a .177 caliber Sportier Class air rifle match. Rifles and equipment must comply with rule “4.0 Air Rifles and Equipment” of the rule book. In addition, rifles currently used in the Kittitas County Shooting Sports Project will also be authorized. Arrangements for use must be made prior to the event. Non county owned rifles must be approved by Superintendent prior to the scheduled shooting time.

National Standard Three Position Air Rifle

Tournament: The course of fire will consist of ten rounds in each of three positions, Prone, Standing, and Kneeling at 10 meters.

Sporter Air Rifle Standing: The course of fire will consist of 10 rounds each in two single spot targets while standing at 10 meters for juniors; Intermediates and seniors course of fire will consist of five rounds in each of four single spot targets while standing at 10 meters.

Air Rifle Silhouette Tournament: This is a .177 caliber Sportier Class air rifle match, scopes and mounts are allowed. Juniors: a 20 shot course of fire consisting of ten boars at 10 yards and ten rams at 15 yards. Intermediates: 30 shot course of fire, consisting of ten boars at 10 yards, ten turkeys at 15 yards and ten rams at 20 yards. Seniors: 40 shot course of fire consisting of ten chickens at 10 yards, ten boars at 15 yards, ten turkeys at 20 yards and ten rams at 25 yards.

Safety Equipment: Approved eye protection is required to be worn by participants.

4. AIR PISTOL

This is a .117 caliber air pistol match for Intermediates and Seniors only. Pistols currently used in the Kittitas County Shooting Sports Project are authorized. Arrangements for use must be made prior to the event. Non county owned rifles must be approved by Superintendent prior to the scheduled shooting time.

Air Pistol Silhouette: This is a .177 caliber air pistol match; scopes and mounts are allowed. Intermediates and seniors: a 40 round course of fire consisting of 10 chickens at 10 yards; 10 boars at 12.5 yards, 10 turkeys at 15 yards, and 10 rams at 18 yards. Shooting will be from left to right in each bank of 5 targets shot twice. Times: 2 ½ minutes per 5 target bank.

Air Pistol Slow Fire: Paper targets set up at 10 meters. Intermediates and Seniors: course of fire consisting of 20 record shots slow fire (one hand standing), 5 shot per bull; five shot strings, 1½ minutes per record shot.

Air Pistol Timed/Rapid Fire Combo: Paper targets set up at 10 meters. Intermediates and seniors: Timed Fire course of fire consisting of 20 record shots (two handed unsupported), 5 shots per bull; five shot strings; 20 seconds per string. Rapid Fire course of fire consisting of 20 record shots (two handed, unsupported), 5 shots per bull; 5 shot strings, 10 seconds per string.

Safety Equipment: Approved eye protection is required to be worn by participants.

5. **.22 SMALLBORE RIFLE**

This is a .22 caliber rifle match. Non county owned rifles must be approved by Superintendent prior to the scheduled shooting time.

NRA Smallbore Rifle – Four Position Tournament:

Open/peep sights only, no telescopic sights will be allowed. Course of fire will consist of ten rounds in each position: Prone, Sitting, Kneeling, and Standing. Juniors at 25 yards; Intermediates and Seniors at 50 yards. Times: 1 minute per record shot prone; 2 minutes per record shot standing; and 1½ minutes per record shot kneeling and sitting.

.22 Smallbore Silhouette Tournaments:

This is a .22 caliber rifle match, scopes may be used. Juniors: a 20 shot course of fire consisting of 10 boars at 20 yards and 10 rams at 30 yards. Intermediates: 30 shot course of fire, consisting of 10 boars at 20 yards, 10 turkeys at 30 yards and 10 rams at 40 yards. Seniors: 40 shot course of fire consisting of 10 chickens at 20 yards, 10 boars at 30 yards, 10 turkeys at 40 yards, and 10 rams at 50 yards. Shooting will be from left to right in each bank of 5 targets shot twice. Times: 2 ½ minutes per 5 target bank.

Venue: Events to be held at the Cascade Field & Stream Club Range on Hayward Hill.

Safety Equipment: Approved hearing and eye protection are required to be worn by participants.

6. **.22 SMALLBORE PISTOL**

This is a .22 caliber pistol match for Seniors only. Pistols currently used in the Kittitas County Shooting Sports Project are authorized. Arrangements for use must be made prior to the event. Non county owned pistols must be approved by Superintendent prior to the scheduled shooting time. All events are “single pistol”

matches, meaning participants are to shoot the entire course of fire of that event with the same pistol. No pistol changes will be allowed between stages. Only one pistol per shooter is allowed on the line. No bolt action pistols, including cannon bolt, turn bolt, or straight bolt will be permitted.

SMALLBORE HUNTER PISTOL SILHOUTETTE: This is a .22 caliber air pistol match: scopes and mounts are allowed. A 40 round course of fire consisting of ten chickens at 40 meters; ten boars at 50 meters, ten turkeys at 75 meters, and ten rams at 100 meters. Shooting will be from left to right in each bank of 5 targets shot twice. Times: 30 second ready time, 2 minute firing time per 5 target bank. Only standing positions may be used, two-hand holds permitted but the hands and arms must be free of the body and may not touch beyond the wrist (NRA Rule 5.8)

SLOW FIRE BULLSEYE – single stage: Paper targets set up at 25 yards. Course of fire consisting of 20 record shots slow fire (one hand standing), 10 shots per 10 minute string.

CAMP PERRY ROUND (modified): Paper targets set up at 25 yards for 25 record shots. Slow Fire course of fire consists of 5 shots in a 5 minute string; Timed Fire course of fire consisting of 10 record shots, 20 seconds per 5 shot string; and Rapid Fire course of fire consisting of 10 record shots, 10 seconds per 5 shot string. All positions are one hand standing.

Venue: Events to be held at the Cascade Field & Stream Club Range on Hayward Hill.

Safety equipment: Approved eye and ear protection is required to be worn by participants.

7. **SHOTGUN**

Standard American (ATA) Trap: 1 round (25 targets) for Juniors, two rounds (50 targets) for Intermediates and Seniors, consisting of 5 targets per turn for each participant in rotating order, for a total of 5 turns at firing line at a distance of 16 yards. In the event of a tie, the Superintendent may increase the distance up to 27 yards for a shoot off. Any unmodified .410, 20, or 12 gauge shotgun may be used. Factory ammunition is required for the above events. Shotguns must be approved by Superintendent prior to the scheduled shooting time. American Trap Association rules to apply. **Standard American (NSSA) Skeet:** 1 round (25 targets) for Juniors, Intermediates, and Seniors, consisting of singles and doubles from stations 1, 2, 6, and 7 and singles from 3, 4, 5, and 8. In the event of a tie, shooters will shoot sudden-death skeet round. Any

shotgun 12 gauge or smaller, capable of firing two shots without reloading, may be used in skeet. National Skeet Shooting Association rules to apply.

Venue: Shotgun events to be held at Pomona Gun Club, Yakima, WA.

Ammunition/Shotguns: Factory ammunition is required for the above events. Shotguns must be approved by Superintendent prior to the scheduled shooting time. **Safety Equipment:** Approved hearing and eye protection are required to be worn by participants.
